The training provided by the Southern Adirondack Chapter shall be as outlined in “The Training and Care of the Versatile Hunting Dog” (The Green Book). The trainer should be familiar with the following chapters for the following dates. The standard to which the dog and handler will be held to for testing can be found in the “Aims, Programs and Test Rules” booklet.

Rules:

- All dogs on leash, staked out, or kenneled unless participating in training.
- All training sessions will begin with 15-30 minutes of heel, whoa, and come, on leash as a group.
- Please be punctual.
- Have a goal (At what point would you like to be at by the end of the training day).

Pointing is not taught to a dog. The dog is born with the potential for pointing. The trainer can only help develop and direct the potential.

Sitting and staying quietly at a precise spot for extended periods of time such as remaining at a blind while waterfowl hunting.
